## GLOBALIZATION


- UVI currently has a Passport to the World program. In Fall, 2016, a group of faculty, staff and students travelled to India South Africa was planned for this Fall, but will be postponed.
- UVI has memoranda of understanding with various institutions internationally. Spring, 2017 UVI hosted two students from Aalborg University in Denmark, and Fall 2017, UVI is hosting one student from Denmark.
- In addition to students from St. Maarten, UVI's PhD program enrolled five students from the Marshall Islands and one from Guam.
- UVI has increased the number of international students enrolled.

#### DEVELOPMENT October 01, 2016 – September 30, 2017


